Pesticide Train-the-Trainer for Fieldworkers and Handlers

Course Description

The State Department of Pesticide Regulation (DPR) and Federal Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) require that agricultural employers train employees who handle pesticides or who enter pesticide-treated fields. This seminar is available for both fieldworkers and handlers.

“Train-the-Trainer” for Fieldworkers — This half-day session will qualify participants to train fieldworkers in pesticide safety and issue training verification cards, commonly known as the “Blue Card.” The following topics will be addressed:

- Pesticide training regulations and requirements
- How to conduct effective training
- Hazard Communication for fieldworkers
- Field entry after application and early-entry requirements
- Documentation and recordkeeping requirements

“Train-the-Trainer” for Handlers — This full-day session will qualify participants to train employees who handle, mix, load, or apply pesticides. In addition to the topics listed above, attendees will be trained on the following:

- Training requirements for handlers
- How to effectively train on all of the required topics for those who handle pesticides
- Respiratory protection requirements
